Innovation without Permission?

 In the knowledge economy, copyright is too often seen as an impediment rather than a facilitator.

Two basic questions arise most frequently:

- Why can't I access it now?
- Why do I have to pay?

Negative or slow responses have led to some radical solutions ...


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Friend or Foe?

The colour is grey...


• And if copyright law were a genre, then it would probably be one where nothing is what it seems, the weather wet and foggy and the ethical boundaries permanently blurred ...

## Copyright Wait your term

- Sound recording 70 years from date of recording
- **Performers' Rights** 70 years from date of performance
- Film 70 years from the death of the last of the main contributors: the Director,
   the Script Writer, and the Composer

Law / Licence

A Copyright problem in education is often a licensing issue. For instance:

- TV and radio access for students based overseas
- Using copyrighted material in a MOOC
- Running a film club

#### 1988 Copyright, Designs and Patents Act – improvements since 2014

- More accessible copies for differently abled users
- Improved levels of quotation
- Making archive copies
- Fair dealing extended
- Data mining easier

However, not all hunky dory, obviously ...



The Sound of Licence

- Why can't I copy my CDs?
- Why did Woody Allen get sued for using seven words by William Faulkner?
- Why did Blake Morrison pay £1,000 to use 11 words from 'I Shot the Sheriff' in a novel?
- And photographic agencies keep suing for lost revenue ...



Right to a defence

It is not a defence to copyright infringement claims to say:

- I was too busy to clear the rights
- I didn't want to pay the licence fee
- I believe it should all be open and free
